Independence House, Yarmouth Police and the Cape and Islands District Attorney's Office are collaborating on the annual event at Cape Cod Community College where men will pledge not to commit violence against women and children.

The White Ribbon Campaign began in 1991 after 14 female students were targeted because of their gender and killed by a gunman at the University of Montreal.

Members of the Cape Cod Community College police department and the Yarmouth, Barnstable and other Cape Cod police departments will be taking part.

The event is part of the 12th annual Statewide Commonwealth of Massachusetts White Ribbon Day.

It is scheduled for Thursday March 21st from 11-1 at the College's West Barnstable campus. The public is invited, there is no charge.


